Questions

Bible Study:

What does the larger section of Colossians 3:5-17 tell us about the context of peace referred to in vs. 15? Note the textual topics and themes in vs. 5-17 that help reveal to us the context of vs. 15:

How are peacemaking and evangelism connected to one another?

Vs. 15 says that Christ is the source of our peace (it is “of Christ”). What does it mean that our peace is “of Christ?”

What does it mean for the peace of Christ to “rule in your hearts?”

“Your Story:”

How was conflict addressed in your home? How has this negatively or positively affected how you do conflict today?

Application:

Are your personal proclivities in conflict towards avoidance or abuse?

What is one relationship in your life where the peace of Christ is not ruling you in your interactions with this person?

- Capture a Vision: What would look differently about your relationship with this person if you were ruled by the peace of Christ?
- Now meditate on how Christ has made peace between you and God. What does this say to you about how you are to make peace with this particular person?
- If a person has offended you, do you need to gently confront the offense?
- What are things about this person and about your relationship with this person for which you can give thanks to God?

Prayer Time: Spend time simply giving thanks to God for His many blessings
